



## SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Your Ford Tractor embodies all the safety features consistent with good performance. Safety features alone, however, will not prevent accidents caused by carelessness. The following safety precautions are suggested to help prevent such accidents.



- Do not permit anyone to ride on the tractor with the operator.
- 2. The operator should never leave the tractor seat when the tractor is in motion.
- Use care when operating on steep grades to maintain proper stability.
- Always drive tractor at safe speeds, especially when operating over rough ground, near ditches or when turning.
- 5. Keep the tractor in gear when going downhill.
- Always shut off the engine when leaving the tractor.
- 7. Make sure the brake pawls, on the 4-speed and 5-speed tractors, are set when parking the tractor.
- 8. Always keep the tractor brakes in proper operating condition.
- Do not refuel the tractor when the engine is overheated or running.
- Keep the tractor keys where they are not available to children.



- 11. Remember, a careful operator is the best insurance against an accident.
- 12. Safety light equipment should be installed on implements being transported on the highway after dark. See your Ford Tractor and Implement Dealer for safety light equipment that conforms to your State and local regulations.

## TRACTOR MODEL AND SERIAL NUMBER

Row Crop Ford Tractors are identified by model numbers, which indicate the type of tractor, engine, transmission and clutch ordered.

When ordering parts or requesting information from your Ford Tractor and Implement Dealer, always specify the Model and Serial Number of your Ford Tractor.

The Model and Serial Number is located on the left front side of the transmission housing and should be recorded immediately in the space provided below.

# FRONT WHEEL TYPES

Your new Ford Tractor is equipped with one of three front wheel types, each of which contributes to the over-all desired working performance of your particular model.

The Dual Front Wheel, Single Front Wheel and Adjustable Front Axle Row Crop Ford Tractors were designed to cover a wide range of planting and cultivating operations, with and without front mounted equipment.

Owners of either the single wheel, the adjustable front axle, or the dual front wheel Ford Tractors may take advantage of the pedestal feature of these tractors. Any of the above front axle options may be obtained from your local Ford Tractor and Implement Dealer, at additional cost.

Each of these front wheel types is described in this section so that you may be afforded an opportunity to acquaint yourself with the versatility of your new Ford Tractor.



Apply both brakes evenly when making sudden stops.



#### **DUAL FRONT WHEEL MODELS**

The dual front wheel Ford Tractor is available in both the 2000 and 4000 Series. With its tricycle feature, it is desirable for use with front mounted equipment for planting and cultivating operations.

## SINGLE FRONT WHEEL MODELS

The single front wheel, shown in Figure 1, is bolted to the tractor "pedestal", and is available in both the 2000 and 4000 Series Tractors. This model is especially desirable for use in irrigated fields.

#### ADJUSTABLE FRONT AXLE MODELS

The adjustable front axle Ford Tractor is a four wheel model, available in both the 2000 and 4000 Series. It is especially adaptable to plowing and accommodates most other equipment normally associated with four wheel tractors.

## CONTROLS AND INSTRUMENTS

The controls on your new Ford Tractor are designed to help you do more work with the greatest possible convenience and comfort. All are within easy reach and are simple to operate.

The well-grouped instruments tell you, at a glance, whether the engine is operating efficiently and warn you of the possibility of trouble before it becomes serious.

Before attempting to start or operate your new tractor, familiarize yourself with the location and function of all controls and instruments.
