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Safety Suggestions

The safety of the operator was one of the prime considerations in the minds of John Deere engineers when this mower-conditioner was designed. Shielding, simple adjustments, and other safety features were built into the mower-conditioner wherever possible.

You can make your farm a safer place to live and work if you observe the safety suggestions given. Study these suggestions carefully and insist that they be followed by those working with you and for you.

All machinery should be operated only by responsible people who have been delegated to do so.

Before starting, make sure bystanders are clear of the mower-conditioner so they cannot be struck by moving parts or caught in a drive belt or chain.

Never walk behind the mower-conditioner while it is operating.

Never clean, oil, or adjust the mower-conditioner with the tractor engine running.

Do not leave mower-conditioner unattended with cutting platform raised. Always lower it to the ground. Never adjust mower-conditioner with power engaged.

Be especially careful when operating on hillsides. The mower-conditioner may tip sideways if it strikes a hole, ditch, or other irregularity.

Provide a first-aid kit for use in case of accident. Use proper antiseptics on scratches and cuts without delay.

Never attempt to clear obstructions off the cutting platform unless the mower-conditioner is stopped and the tractor engine shut off.

Clothing worn by the mower-conditioner operator should be fairly tight and belted. Loose jackets, skirts, shirts, or sleeves should never be worn because of the danger of clothing getting into moving parts.

Replace badly frayed or worn belts before they break.

Never operate 540 rpm mower-conditioner with 1000 rpm tractor.

Escaping fluid under pressure can have sufficient force to penetrate the skin causing serious personal injury. Before disconnecting lines, be sure to relieve all pressure. Before applying pressure to the system, be sure all connections are tight and that lines and hoses are not damaged. Fluid escaping from a very small hole can be almost invisible. Use a piece of cardboard or wood, rather than the hands, to search for suspected leaks.

If injured by escaping fluid, see a doctor at once. Serious infection can develop if proper medical treatment is not administered immediately.

When transporting the mower-conditioner on a road or highway at night or during the day, use accessory lights and devices for adequate warning to operators of other vehicles. In this regard, check local governmental regulations. Various lights and devices are available from your John Deere dealer. Clean the SMV (Slow Moving Vehicle) emblem before transporting the mower-conditioner on a road or highway.



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
