THIS MANUAL SHOULD BE CONSIDERED a permanent part of your posthole digger and should remain with the posthole digger when you sell it.


MEASUREMENTS in this manual are U.S. customary units and their metric equivalents.

RIGHT-HAND AND LEFT-HAND sides are determined by facing in the direction of forward travel.

WRITE IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS in the Specifications section. Accurately record all the numbers to help in tracing the posthole digger should it be stolen. Your dealer also needs these numbers when you order parts. If this manual is kept on the posthole digger, also file the identification numbers in a secure place off the machine.

WARRANTY is provided as part of John Deere's support program for customers who operate and maintain their equipment as described in this manual. The warranty is explained on the warranty certificate which you should have received from your dealer.

This warranty provides you the assurance that John Deere will back its products where defects appear within the warranty period. In some circumstances, John Deere also provides field improvements, often without charge to the customer, even if the product is out of warranty. Should the equipment be abused, or modified to change its performance beyond the original factory specifications, the warranty will become void and field improvements may be denied.


FOLLOW SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

AVOID TIPPING


DO NOT drive where tractor could slip or tip.

Slow down before you make turns.

Slow down when you drive on hillsides. Avoid holes, rocks, roots, and drop-offs.

When operating on slopes:

- Install front weight before you operate on slopes.
- Operate up and down slopes—not across.
- · Avoid sudden stops and starts.
- · Be careful when you change directions.
- · Avoid parking.




