

This warranty provides you the assurance that John Deere will back its products where defects appear within the warranty period. In some circumstances, often without charge to the customer, even if the product is out of warranty.

Warranty and field improvements are a part of John Deere's product support program for customers who operate and maintain their equipment as described in this manual. Should the equipment be abused, or modified to change its performance beyond the original factory specifications, the warranty will become void and field improvements may be denied. Setting fuel delivery above specifications or otherwise overpowering machines will result in such action.

Safety



Operate Safely

DO NOT operate stripper without reading this operator's manual.

DO NOT operate stripper with more than one person on the machine.

Come to a complete stop before reversing direction.

DO NOT operate close to a ditch or creek.

Slow down when turning.

Drive slowly over rough ground.


DO NOT dump on a slope or grade.

DO NOT dump when someone is near stripper.

DO NOT drive the stripper with the basket raised.

DO NOT dump near overhead wires.

DO NOT start engine unless main gear shift lever is in Park.




Protect Against Noise

Prolonged exposure to loud noise can cause impairment or loss of hearing.

Wear a suitable hearing protective device such as earmuffs (A) or earplugs (B) to protect against objectionable or uncomfortable loud noises.

Avoid Fires

DO NOT operate stripper without two fire extinguishers near by. Fire extinguishers and mounting brackets are available. Order JD AT62018 and AT62019 from your John Deere Dealer.

Ladder Mounted

Avoid Fires (Continued)

To prevent plugging, engage fan before engaging stripping units.

DO NOT dump basket near electrical wires.

DO NOT dump into the wind. Wind could blow lint onto a hot engine.

DO NOT refuel with the engine running.

DO NOT smoke or use a latern when refueling.

Keep the engine and units free from trash.



KNOW the transport height of your stripper and beware of overhead wires.

DO NOT transport without first raising the units.

When driving the cotton stripper on a road or highway at night or during the day, use necessary lights and devices for adequate warning to operators of other vehicles. In this regard, check local governmental regulations. Various safety lights and devices are available from your John Deere dealer.

DO NOT fail to latch the brakes together.

Stop slowly to avoid "nose-diving."

Keep the SMV emblem and reflectors clean and in place.

FOLD RADIO ANTENNA DOWN.

Unauthorized modifications to the machine may impair the function and/or safety and affect machine life.

Avoid Contact With Moving Parts

Shut off engine and remove key before unplugging stripper.

Keep hands, feet, and clothing away from moving parts.

Practice Safe Maintenance


DO NOT oil or adjust stripper when it is in motion.

Block units or engage safety stop when working under units.

DO NOT check the water level in a hot radiator.

Shut off engine and remove key when working on stripper.

Replace any guards or shields removed for servicina.




Cab Mounted

Mounting Tires

Failure to follow proper procedures when mounting a tire on a wheel or rim can produce an explosion which may result in serious injury or death. Do not attempt to mount a tire unless you have the proper equipment and experience to perform the job. Have it done by your John Deere dealer or a qualified tire repair service.

When seating tire beads on rims, never exceed 35 psi (241 kPa) or maximum inflation pressures specified by tire manufacturers for mounting tires. Inflation beyond this maximum pressure may break the bead, or even the rim, with dangerous explosive force. If both beads are not seated when the maximum recommended pressure is reached, deflate, reposition tire, relubricate bead, and reinflate.

Detailed agricultural tire mounting instructions, including necessary safety precautions, are contained in John Deere Fundamentals of Service (FOS) Manual 55, Tire and Tracks, available through your John Deere dealer. Such information is also available from the Rubber Manufacturers Association and from tire manufacturers.

Hydraulic Fluid

Escaping fluid under pressure can have sufficient force to penetrate the skin, causing serious injury. Before disconnecting lines, be sure to relieve all pressure. Before applying pressure, be sure all connections are tight and lines, pipes and hoses are not damaged. Use a piece of cardboard or wood rather than hands, to search for leaks.

If injured by escaping fluid, see a doctor at once. Serious infection or reaction can develop if proper medical treatment is not administered immediately.


Battery Service

Failure to follow proper procedures when servicing a battery may produce an explosion which can result in serious injury or death. Do not attempt to service a battery unless you have the proper equipment and experience to perform the job. Have it done by your John Deere dealer or another qualified dealer. Detailed battery information, including necessary safety precautions are contained in John Deere Fundamentals of Service (FOS) Manual 20, Electrical Systems, available through your John Deere dealer.

Additional information is also available from battery and battery charger manufacturers.






Blower

Operate blower with door and window closed.





Heater


Control temperature with the heater and blower switch.






Air Conditioning Temperature

Blower switch must be turned on before air conditioning will operate.

IMPORTANT: When outside temperature is below 100 degrees F. (38° C.), turn switch fully clockwise, then back 1/4 turn to avoid burning thermal fuse.

Control humidity by also turning heater on.

Wiper

The wiper will return to its "Park" position when the switch is turned off.

Dome Light

The light operates when main key switch is turned on.

Air Filter and Hydraulic and Hydrostatic Oil Indicators

Oil indicator and air filter indicator will light when key switch is in start position. If system is overheating or air filter needs to be replaced, indicator lights will glow when stripper is operating.

Voltmeter

With key switch on and engine stopped, voltmeter should reach left-hand green range. If it does not, batteries are undercharged. With engine running, it should rise to right-hand green range. If needle stays in either amber band, see your John Deere dealer.

Louvered Air Outlets

Adjust louvers (bold arrows) to direct air where needed, such as for defoggoing windows.

Standard Seat

Pull lever out to unlock seat and slide to desired position. Release lever and slide seat until it locks.

Optional Suspension Seat

Push down Lever (A) and move seat to desired height.

Release lever.

Turn crank (B) clockwise for firm ride. Turn counterclockwise for softer ride. Handle flips out to crank.


Sit and turn knob (B) until yellow indicator (C) inside tube is flush with tube.

Move the lever (D) outward to the left. Move the seat forward or rearward to desired position. Release lever.

- D Forward and Rearward Lever


Adjust backrest as follows:


- 1. Loosen two capscrews on each side.
- 2. Move backrest to desired position.
- 3. Tighten capscrews.
