Introduction

This manual should be considered a permanent part of your machine and should remain with the machine when you sell it.

Right-hand and left-hand sides are determined by facing in the direction the implement will travel when going forward.




This machine is of metric design. Measurements in this manual are metric with the customary U.S. measurement following. Use only metric hardware and tools as specified.

Write product identification numbers in the space provided in the Specifications section. Accurately record all the numbers to help in tracing the machine should it be stolen. Your dealer also needs these numbers when you order parts. If this manual is kept on the machine, also file the identification numbers in a secure place off the machine.

Warranty is provided as part of John Deere's support program for customers who operate and maintain their equipment as described in this manual. The warranty is explained on the warranty certificate which you should have received from your dealer.

This warranty provides you the assurance that John Deere will back its products where defects appear within the warranty period. In some circumstances, John Deere also provides field improvements, often without charge to the customer, even if the product is out of warranty. Should the equipment be abused, or modified to change its performance beyond the original factory specifications, the warranty will become void and field improvements may be denied. Setting fuel delivery above specifications or otherwise overpowering machines will result in such action.

The tire manufacturer's warranty supplied with your machine may not apply outside the U.S.

PREDELIVERY	
After the machine has been completely assembled, inspect to be sure it is in good running order before delivering to the customer. The following checklist is a reminder of points to inspect. Check off each item as it is found satisfactory or after proper adjustment is made. SMV emblem and reflectors installed. All grease fittings have been lubricated. Tires are properly inflated. 

FOLLOW SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Carefully read all safety messages in this manual and on your machine safety signs. Keep safety signs in good condition. Replace missing or damaged safety signs.

Learn how to operate the machine and how to use controls properly. Do not let anyone operate without instruction.

Keep your machine in proper working condition. Unauthorized modifications to the machine may impair the function and/or safety and affect machine life.





OPERATE SAFELY

Never ride or permit others to ride on the plow.

When the plow is in a raised position, be sure rockshaft lever is not bumped or touched by anyone.

Lower the support stand to help support the plow before unhitching from the tractor.

Stand clear of plow when raising or lowering.

Stay clear of the reset path if the standards hang in a partially-tripped position from an obstruction or during maintenance.

Do not attempt to adjust the plow while it is in motion.

For tractor stability and operator safety, tractor front end weights and/or liquid ballast in the front tires may be required. (See Front Ballast in Preparing the Tractor section.)

Keep children and pets a safe distance away.

Follow all safety precautions stated in your tractor operator's manual.

Always lower the plow to the ground when not in use.

KEEP RIDERS OFF MACHINE

Only allow the operator on the machine. Keep riders off.

Riders on machine are subject to injury such as being struck by foreign objects and being thrown off of the machine. Riders also obstruct the operator's view resulting in the machine being operated in an unsafe manner.

Keep a first aid kit and fire extinguisher handy.



Wear close fitting clothing and safety equipment appropriate to the job.




USE SAFETY LIGHTS AND DEVICES
